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1. Club Name

1.1. The organization shall be known as the LOST TRACKS MEN'S CLUB

2. Guiding Principles – Purpose, Values, Services & Vision

2.1. Our Purpose – Why do we do what we do?

2.1.1. Promote the playing of golf by striving to enhance what the game can offer.

2.2. Our Values – How are we going to go about doing what we do in a way that reflects our very basic values?

2.2.1. Learning, Honoring, & Valuing - To conserve and promote the best interest and true spirit of the game of golf by learning, honoring, and valuing the traditions, customs, and rules, as well as the profound mysteries of the game itself.

2.2.2. Integrity – The game of golf can offer the opportunity to teach lessons in integrity, discipline, honesty, and character.

2.2.3. Enjoyment - Having fun and enjoying the moment by taking pleasure in the game, in your companions, and your surroundings.

2.2.4. Sportsmanship – Having a friendly, yet competitive spirit, within competition, by practicing good sportsmanship (being a true gentleman), and adhering to the rules of the game.

2.2.5. Support & Encouragement – Provide a supportive and encouraging environment for all of our members, not only for growth and improvement in their game, but also in their relationships with each other and in their own personal lives.

2.3. Our Services – What is it that we will actually be offering so that we can fulfill our purpose?

2.3.1. Opportunities – Provide multiple opportunities for our members to be engaged in playing the game of golf in various events, outings, competitions, and other venues, as well as hosting occasional social gatherings to promote and foster positive fellowship, a common bond, and fraternity for their joint and mutual benefit.

2.3.2. Advocate – Serve as an advocate and/or intermediary (Executive Board) for the Men's Club in manners pertaining to the overall good will, benefit, affordability, course improvements, and positive relationship with Lost Tracks Golf Club (owners and management).

2.3.3. Handicapping & Rules – Oversee the appropriate oversight and enforcement (as necessary) of each member's handicap as well as keeping members informed and up-to-date on all USGA/OGA rules, rule changes, and proper interpretations.

2.3.4. Membership – While promoting fellowship and camaraderie among our membership we will also strive to make our club enjoyable, accessible, and affordable, thereby achieving a high level of member retention and the ongoing attraction of new members who will uphold our values and traditions. We will give our members a voice by holding regular club meetings and keep them aware of all events, schedules, and special announcements or changes.

2.4. Our Vision – As we go about doing what we do in a way that reflects our values and fulfills our purpose, will it also get us to where we wish to be in the future?

2.4.1. The “Standard” – What we strive for:

2.4.1.1. To become a golf club known for its outstanding members who exemplify the values of the Club and are respected for their character and integrity within the community.

2.4.1.2. To become a golf club that other players wish to join.

2.4.1.3. The “Standard” which other clubs are measured by and wish to emulate.

2.4.1.4. A highly valued component of Lost Tracks Golf Club

3. By-Laws

3.1. Membership

3.1.1. Membership in the Club shall be open and available to all men who:

3.1.1.1. Uphold, honor, and practice our values.

3.1.1.2. Pay the annual membership dues - \$75.00.

3.1.1.3. Carry an honest handicap or attain one.

3.1.1.4. Make a commitment to participate on a regular basis.

3.1.1.5. Are willing to volunteer when called upon.

3.1.1.6. Are open to learning new events, meeting new people, and having fun.

3.1.2. Each member of the Club in good standing shall receive all benefits negotiated for or obtained on behalf of the members by the Executive Board.

3.1.3. All membership fees and dues shall be established by member vote in such amounts, as they deem adequate to operate and maintain the Club.

3.2. Men’s Club Meetings

3.2.1. Meetings are held the last Wednesday of each month (April – October).

3.2.2. The President shall conduct all meetings. The order of business for all meetings shall be:

3.2.2.1. Required quorum achieved. In order to conduct an official meeting there shall be a minimum of 15 LTMC members in attendance.

3.2.2.2. Review and approval of minutes of previous meeting.

3.2.2.3. Review/discussion of any unfinished business.

3.2.2.4. Reports of Board Members.

3.2.2.5. New business.

3.2.2.6. Adjournment.

3.2.2.7. Note: Roberts Rule's of Order, Revised, shall be the final authority as to parliamentary procedure at all meetings, insofar as they do not conflict with any provisions of the Lost Tacks Men's Club By-laws.

3.3. Executive Board

- 3.3.1. Executive Board members shall perform those duties as assigned to them in accordance with the policies of this organization and any other duties that may arise which the membership and/or Board shall assign.
- 3.3.2. No member of the Executive Board shall accept any discount, property, or other valuable consideration that would place his position as a member of the Executive Board in a conflict of interest.
- 3.3.3. Committees: The President shall appoint the Chair and all committee members and such members shall be members in good standing. The Executive Board shall authorize and define the specific task(s) and time frame for all committees.
- 3.3.4. A member may serve on only one committee at any one time with the exception of any Executive Board members serving as a representative of the Executive Board.
- 3.3.5. The Executive Board shall be composed of five members, in good standing, of the Club.

3.3.5.1. President

- 3.3.5.1.1. Lead & oversee the Executive Board
- 3.3.5.1.2. Coordinate with Lost Tracks Golf Club ownership
- 3.3.5.1.3. Appoint Committees (with Board authorization)
- 3.3.5.1.4. Call Membership meetings as needed
- 3.3.5.1.5. Develop & prioritize yearly goals (with Board approval)
- 3.3.5.1.6. Maintain focus on Values & Purpose

3.3.5.2. Vice President

- 3.3.5.2.1. Take Chair's role in his absence as needed
- 3.3.5.2.2. Coordinate work of the EB w/President
- 3.3.5.2.3. Coordinate all documents (updates of the Handbook, financials, LT Cup points, etc.) w/Sect. & Finance
- 3.3.5.2.4. Track To-Do's

3.3.5.3. Secretary

- 3.3.5.3.1. Record all meeting minutes
- 3.3.5.3.2. Maintain an updated data base of Members
- 3.3.5.3.4. Communicate with members as needed
- 3.3.5.3.5. Conduct "Official" correspondence on behalf of the Men's Club (Executive Board & Membership)

3.3.5.4. Competition & Finance Director

- 3.3.5.4.1. Oversee, Track, & record all official competitions (Head Decision Maker)
- 3.3.5.4.2. Post & track Wednesday winners
- 3.3.5.4.3. Oversee, Track, & Report on all Finances
- 3.3.5.4.4. Guide & Coordinate Rule changes/updates with Handicap Director

3.3.5.5. Handicap Director

- 3.3.5.5.1. Oversee, Track, & Post Member Handicaps (1st & 15th)
- 3.3.5.5.2. Regularly Remind & Keep Members up-to-date on Rules (USGA & Local) in consultation with Competition & Finance Director
- 3.3.5.5.3. Oversee appropriate Tee Box assignments

3.3.5.6. Ex Officio Membership Representation (2 non-voting LTMC members)

- 3.3.5.6.1. Provide input, advice, and insights to the EB from membership perspective
- 3.3.5.6.2. Bring realistic suggestions, questions, concerns, etc. to the Executive Board from membership
- 3.3.5.6.3. Provide a conduit from membership to the Executive Board so that membership has a viable “voice” at all Executive Board meetings

3.3.5.7. Lost tracks Cup Points Coordinator (appointed by President; non-voting Board member)

- 3.3.5.7.1. Collect & coordinate all Lost Tracks Cup Gross, Net and total points accrued by members during the Season (April 1-September 30)
- 3.3.5.7.2. Provide regular and timely updates in Lost Tracks Cup Standings during the season
- 3.3.5.7.3. Provide input, concerns and questions to the Executive Board regarding Lost Tracks Cup Points

3.4. Executive Board Election Process

- 3.4.1. In August – every year – the President shall appoint a nominating committee of three members in good standing. This committee will solicit names of candidates for the Executive Board positions to serve for the next two years. Upcoming elections: 2026, 2027, 2028, 2029, and 2030. President & Treasurer/Competition Coordinator are up for election in even years while elections for Vice President, Secretary & Handicap Director are in odd years.
- 3.4.2. A final slate of candidate names will be sent to all Men’s Club members prior to the September meeting.
- 3.4.3. At the September or October meeting voting will be conducted and the new Executive Board will be selected.
- 3.4.4. The newly elected Executive Board will be responsible for planning and communicating the next year’s Men’s Club activities and events.
- 3.4.5. Each member in attendance at the meeting shall be entitled to one vote for each Board position. No absentee votes allowed.
- 3.4.6. A member elected to a position on the Executive Board shall retain his position for a period of two year unless the member resigns or is removed from office for just cause by the membership.
- 3.4.7. If a member of the Board is unable to complete his term of office, a

member appointed by the Chairman will fill his position.

3.5. The books, records, and accounts of the Club shall be kept by the Secretary and Competition and Finances Board members and shall be presented, upon request in writing, to the Executive Board.

3.6. A financial statement of the previous year and a projected spending plan for coming year shall be presented to the members at the initial general meeting each year for approval by members.

3.7. Minutes of all open Club member meetings shall be distributed to all members within one week after the meeting.

3.8. Minutes of all Committee meetings shall be shared at the next Executive Board meeting that follows the committee meeting in writing (copies for each of the five Board members).

3.9. At all General or Special meetings Robert's Rules of Order shall be the guideline for both process and order.

3.10. The Executive Board shall have the power to repeal or amend any by-law, regulation, or duty upon receiving the approval of a 2/3rds majority of the members present at the Annual winter meeting.

3.11. Any member may submit proposed changes to repeal or amend any by-law, regulation, or duty by properly submitting in writing such proposal to the Executive Board at least 30 days prior to an Annual winter, General, or Special meeting.

4. Expectations, Guidelines & Practices

4.1. Expectations of Club Members

- 4.1.1. Members are expected to conduct themselves in such a manner that exemplifies the Club's Values, supports its Services, and contributes to its Vision and will not bring the name or image of the Club into disrepute.
- 4.1.2. Members of the Club are expected to abide by and enforce the USGA Rules of Golf. These rules apply except where local rules prevail.
- 4.1.3. To uphold the integrity of the Club at all times every member is expected to post their individual score upon completion of every round in a timely fashion (within 24 hours). Posting of scores includes those rounds played that are not part of the Club schedule or special outings and events.
- 4.1.4. No member shall knowingly submit a false or incorrect scorecard.
- 4.1.5. When called upon or appropriate, due to the event, match, or tournament being played, scorecards shall be exchanged between players and/or teams.
- 4.1.6. All members are expected and required to abide by conditions set forth in the by-laws.
- 4.1.7. In the event a member violates the purpose and intent of the Men's Club by-laws, he may be suspended or expelled for good cause, including but not limited to: Violations of rules, handicap infractions, and/or any conduct which results in adverse reflection on the Men's Club.
 - 4.1.7.1. Suspension or expulsion will be taken by a unanimous vote of the Men's Club Executive Board.
 - 4.1.7.2. If a member is suspended or expelled, that member shall forfeit his right to vote and shall be ineligible for all Men's Club activities for a period of time designated by the Executive Board according to the merit of each infraction.

4.2. Schedule/Calendar

4.2.1. Official Lost Tracks Men's Club play is on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from April 1 –October 31.

Note: an existing member must sponsor any "Guest(s)". The President or another Executive Board Member (in his absence) must approve special exemptions to this rule.

4.2.1.1. First Starting Tee Times are as follows:

April – 10:00 am

May – 9:00 am

June, July, August – 8:30 am

September-9:00 am

October-10 am

4.2.1.2. Mondays – Skins

4.2.1.3. Wednesdays – Individual and Team competition. On Individual medal/stroke play two flights will be set up and payouts will be for

both “net” and “gross.” Lost Track points will be awarded for all Wednesday games for both “Gross” and “Net.”

4.2.1.3.1.10 Handicap Differential Rule is in effect for Two Man Competition play only.

4.2.1.4.Thursdays – Counters (Players can earn points based on net & gross score on each hole. The team with the highest number of points wins.) ****Members will be notified in advance if the Thursday format is altered for special events (i.e. Horse Race).***

4.2.1.4.1.Random ball drop for selection of teams commences 20 minutes before the first slated tee time.

4.2.2. Sign-up Policy

4.2.2.1. Monday Events

4.2.2.1.1. Members shall sign-up no later than 5:00 pm on the preceding Friday.

4.2.2.2. Wednesday Events

4.2.2.2.1. Members shall sign-up no later than 30 minutes aqer the last group has completed play on the preceding Monday.

4.2.2.3.Thursday Events

4.2.2.3.1. Members shall sign-up no later than 5:00 pm on the preceding Tuesday.

4.2.2.4.Other Events (including Match Play, Home & Homes, Horse Race & other ancillary competitions)

4.2.2.4.1.Sign-up deadlines will be announced for each event.

4.2.2.4.2. If an event is full, members can sign-up on the “Waiting List” located on the backside of the Event sign-up sheet.

4.2.2.4.3. A member should not sign-up another member without the other member’s approval.

4.2.3. Cancellation Policy

4.2.3.1. The Lost Tracks Men's Club (LTMC) has a responsibility to both the Lost Tracks G.C. and to its Members to insure timely sign-up. Cancellations. Accordingly, the following Cancellation policy shall be in effect:

4.2.3.1.1. Sign-Up Cancellations for any event shall be completed 24 hours prior to the start of the event.

4.2.3.1.2. Cancellations can be completed by calling the Clubhouse.

4.2.3.1.3. If you do not Cancel 24 hours before the event:

4.2.3.1.3.1.Your name will be recorded on the Season Cancellation List.

4.2.3.1.3.2.Optional: Without divulging personal sensitive information, an Email giving a general explanation for your Cancellation, may be submitted to the Club Secretary as soon as practical. Acceptance of your explanation is at the sole discretion of the Executive Board.

4.2.3.1.4. You may be assessed an Event Entry Fee, if applicable.

4.2.3.1.5. Cancellations due to illness, or other foreseen circumstances are understandable.

4.2.3.1.6. Members who show a pattern of cancellations during the season, may be subject to Board discipline, including suspension, or revocation. Discipline will be at the sole discretion of the Board.

4.2.4. No-Show Policy

4.2.4.1. Members who fail to show-up for their tee time, will be assessed a \$10 Entry Fee (If applicable) unless waived by the Executive Board

4.2.4.2. In addition, without divulging personal sensitive information, an email shall be submitted to the Secretary, or any member of the Executive Board explaining the reasons for the No-Show as soon as practical.

4.2.4.3. No-Shows due to illness, or other unforeseen circumstances are understandable, however, a written note as required in 4.2.4.2 shall be submitted as soon as practical. Acceptance of the reasons for a No-Show is at the sole discretion of the Executive Board.

4.2.4.4. Members who No-Show for a Wednesday or major event more than twice throughout the season, may have their playing privileges with the LTMC suspended or revoked. Members who show a pattern of No-Shows during the season for any event will be subject to Executive Board discipline, including suspension or revocation. Discipline will be at the sole discretion of the Executive Board.

4.2.5. Pace of Play Policy

4.2.5.1. As part of the Lost Tracks Men's Club (LTMC) program, it is of utmost importance that all participants understand and abide by the "Pace of Play" guidelines set forth below. Regardless of playing ability, all players will be held to the same "Pace of Play" standard in all events.

4.2.5.1.1. The LTMC nor the Lost Tracks G.C. has an interest in penalizing any player, however, a "Pace of Play" policy is necessary to ensure slow play does not detract from the enjoyment of the game for any player on the course.

4.2.5.1.2. Time to Complete Round - It is understood that there could be factors that affect the time it takes to complete a round of golf.

However, under normal playing conditions, all groups are expected to complete 18 holes in 4 hours, and 20 minutes.

4.2.5.1.3. Out of Position - A group will be considered "Out of Position":

4.2.5.1.3.1. When on the Tee of a Par 3, the Group In Front has left the tee of the Next Hole.

4.2.5.1.3.2. When on the Tee of a Par 4, the Group In Front is on the Tee of the Next Hole, or further.

4.2.5.1.3.3. When on the Tee of a Par 5, the Group In Front is putting on the Green of the same Hole.

4.2.5.1.3.4. Note: If a Group finds itself "Out-of-Position", they should at least endeavor to maintain proper positioning with the Group behind them.

4.2.5.1.4. Penalties:

4.2.5.1.4.1. *1st Offense - A group "Out of Position" may receive a verbal warning from a Clubhouse Official or a Member of the Executive Board.

4.2.5.1.4.2. After the 1st offense, it is expected that the group will play "ready golf" and use "continuous putting" whenever possible.

4.2.5.1.4.3. *2nd Offense - If after 2 holes of the 1st offense the group is still "Out of Position", then the group may receive a second warning. At this time, all players will be required to play "ready golf, and use "continuous putting" when on the greens. Failure to do so will result in a 2 stroke penalty assessed on the hole of infraction.

4.2.5.1.4.4. *3rd Offense - A group that continues to be "Out-of-Position" after the 1st and 2nd offense may receive a 3rd notification 2 holes after the 2nd warning. The individuals in the group may lose playing privileges at a forthcoming LTMC event.

4.2.5.1.5. Definitions:

4.2.5.1.5.1. "Ready Golf"--Disregard the etiquette of "honors," and hit your ball when ready.

4.2.5.1.5.2. "Continuous Puttg"--Once you begin putting, you must continue until the ball is holed.

4.2.5.1.5.3. "Ready Golf" and "Continuous Putting" gives slow players/groups the opportunity to return to playing at the recommended pace.

4.2.6. Local Course Rules

4.2.6.1. On any green if your ability to putt from off the green is interfered with: On any hole if a sprinkler or irrigation box, etc. interferes with your ability to putt onto the green, and said box is within 2 club lengths of the putting surface, and also within 2 club lengths of your ball, You may take relief of 1 club length left or right, but no closer to the hole, in order that you may putt your ball onto the green from that position. Both conditions must be true, in order to take relief.

4.2.6.2. Driving Range adjacent to Hole #1. A ball is deemed to be OB on #1 if it is beyond the new white stakes on the driving range. You may re-hit from the tee, hitting 3, or drop to the fairway approx. where your ball crossed out, hitting 4th shot.

4.2.6.3. HOLE # 11 New local Rule: Any tee shot hit OB from the tee to the left side of the green, the player is to re-tee hitting 3 from the tee box.

4.2.6.4. Rock wall next to cart path on # 12: If your ball comes to rest in the rocks 200 yards off tee next to path, relief will be given on that side of

the path up to 2 club lengths to the left side of the wall. No penalty.

4.2.6.5. Tree wells on 15: To clear any confusion about the tree wells on 15. If you are in said tree wells you may take relief of within 2 club lengths out of the well, back in line with the flagstick. This applies to just the tree wells, not the homeowners flower bed edging. That is OB. If you are still behind a tree play it as dropped or you can take an unplayable and move it within 2 club lengths, left or right, for 1 stroke penalty

4.2.6.6. Green on # 16: Relief for putts is given when your line is impaired by goose damage or excessive sand on this green. Please clear this with your playing partners. No penalty.

4.2.6.7. Fairway divots: Divots are rub of the green. No relief will be given for landing in a divot (USGA rule), unless you choose to take an unplayable for a 1 stroke penalty. Play it as it lies. Please, Let's try to fix all divots while playing

4.2.6.8. Fences, Barriers or OB stakes: If you find yourself in bounds next to a fence, say on Number 1 or 2, or any other fence or manmade golf course boundary on a hole, the ball must be played from that spot OR take 2 club length relief for a 1 stroke penalty. Out of bounds stakes: are exempt from rule and ball may be moved with no penalty.

4.2.6.9. Ball in the rocks around a pond or lake: If your ball is in the rocks (or inside the pond liner), it's in the hazard. You may attempt to hit it from there if you choose, but the rocks are deemed part of the hazard. Drop for a 1 stroke penalty just as if it were in the pond, which may mean taking it back to the other side of the pond or where it crossed into the hazard. Again, no nearer the hole, on line where it crossed in.

4.2.6.11. OUT OF BOUNDS OR LOST BALL: If you lose your ball you may drop one in the fairway (2 club lengths) in on the short grass, for a 2 shot penalty. If you hit your ball out of bounds you may do the same near where you deem it crossed out. While still on the tee or in fairway, you may hit a provisional if you think either of those may have happened. But, once you leave the tee or move on in fairway, you can't go back and hit a provisional! Please declare and identify your provisional to other players.

4.2.7. Wednesday Games Calendar: Official season calendar for Wednesday games is prepared and sent out to all members prior to the start of the season and includes:

4.2.7.1. Information on rules of play for 4-man and 2-man team games.

4.2.7.2. Any additional events scheduled for Club play opportunities if scheduled prior to start of the season. Additional events and opportunities may be scheduled after the official calendar is sent out. All members will be notified about these additions to the calendar as soon as they are officially scheduled.

4.2.7.3. A Guidelines list for members regarding pace of play, scorecard exchange, common golfing courtesies, and other significant helps as determined by the Executive Board.

4.3. Additional Guidelines/Rules of Play

4.3.1. Lost Tracks Golf Club officials will determine frost delays, rainouts, dangerous weather cancellations, etc.

4.3.2. When necessary, scorecards will be turned in to the appropriate individual and must be reviewed and signed before being turned in.

4.3.3. A player, regardless of age, may choose which tees they wish to play from. The guideline for a player's choice of tee box shall be the tees that allow him the ability to achieve why he chooses to play the game," whatever that reason may be: the challenge; the fun; the exercise; etc. The player must officially notify the Handicap Director to move to another tee with the condition that they will continue to play from that tee.

4.3.4. Members are encouraged to resolve any disputes and/or discrepancies in scoring or rules among themselves. If they cannot resolve the issue, they must bring the dispute to the Handicap and Competition Directors for resolution.

4.4. Lost Tracks Cup Points & \$\$ (Shop Credits)

4.4.1. Lost Track cup Points are awarded throughout the season and are distributed according to the following:

4.4.1.1. For individual stroke play events, points will be awarded for low gross and low net (1st Place: 100 pts, 2nd Place: 80 pts., 3rd Place: 60 pts., 4th Place: 40 pts., 5th Place: 20 pts. Participated but did not place-5 pts.)

4.4.1.2. For team (two or 4-man) events: each team member will be awarded points as shown above.

4.4.1.3. Participation in all events is tracked for end-of-the-year recognition.

4.4.1.4. Following the last event of the year, the LT Cup winners will be announced. Awards will go to the first, second, third, fourth & fifth place players with the most total points accumulated for the year:

4.4.1.4.1. Total Gross Points

4.4.1.4.2. Total Low Net Points

4.4.1.4.3. Most Total Points (gross + net points + participation points).

(A player can only win in one of the three award categories.)

4.4.1.5. An updated LT Cup standings sheet will be posted at the end of each month.

4.5. Awards

4.5.1. The following Awards are given at the Annual Awards Luncheon held in November:

4.5.1.1. Club Championship

4.5.1.1.1. Gross – 1st place

4.5.1.1.2. Net – 1st place

4.5.1.2. Match Play Championships

4.5.1.2.1. Winners Bracket - Gross and Net Divisions – 1st place

4.5.1.3. Lost Track Cup Points

4.5.1.3.1. Gross Points – 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th & 5th places

4.5.1.3.2. Net Points – 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th & 5th places

4.5.1.3.3. Total Overall Points – 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th & 5th places

4.5.1.4. Most Improved Golfer – determined by Handicap Chair using OGA data.

4.5.1.5. Most Inspirational Golfer – determined by Executive Board based on nominating committee's submissions and the following criteria:

4.5.1.5.1. Integrity - honesty, forthrightness, true to his word

4.5.1.5.2. Encouraging - supportive, positive, looks out for the good in everyone

4.5.1.5.3. Honors the game of golf - follows all of the rule, assists others in doing the same

4.5.1.5.4. Supports the Men's Club and its decisions - plays according to the decisions the club has made and helps others to understand those decisions and honor them

4.5.1.5.5. Participation - regular and consistent play in most Men's Club events (M, W, and/or Thursdays)

4.5.1.5.6. Inspirational - positively influences and inspires others in improving their game, to play well, play according to the rules of the game, play appropriately and under control emotionally, and play well with those in the foursome.

4.5.1.5.7. All Awards are reviewed and confirmed by the Executive Board.

4.6. Additional Events

4.6.1. At times additional events and opportunities for both official and unofficial Club play may be added to the Calendar.

4.6.2. Official Wednesday Club play events, tournaments, etc., will fall within the Lost Tracks Cup Points awarding system.

4.6.2.1. Club Championship will be held during the last week of August.

4.6.2.2. The LTMC Club Championship is a two day individual stroke play competition with a Gross Champion and a Net Champion.

4.6.2.3. In order to qualify to play in the Club Championship, the following criteria must be met:

1. The individual must be a member of the Lost Tracks Men's Club in good standing

AND

2. The individual played in at least 10 Lost Tracks Men's Club events between April 1 and August 25th (Monday, Wednesday, or Thursday events all qualify).

4.6.3. Unofficial Club play opportunities will not fall within the Lost Tracks Cup Points awarding system.

4.6.4. These events and opportunities may include but are not limited to the following:

4.6.4.1. Home & Home events with other men's golf clubs that are played at both courses. Format is determined by the home club and agreed upon in advance by the away club. Cost determined and agreed upon by both clubs and courses.

4.6.4.2. The Annual Member/Guest Tournament is planned, organized, and carried out by the Member/Guest Tournament Committee.

4.6.4.3. Play days are opportunities for Lost Tracks Men's Club members to play at another local course. The Executive Board shall determine date, cost, and format.

4.6.4.4. Travel golf outings are periodically scheduled and planned by small ad hoc groups or individuals. The small group or individual **determines invites. These outings are not limited only to members** since invites are determined by the small groups or individuals, however, the organizers of these outings are encouraged to invite members to promote good fellowship and camaraderie.

4.6.4.5. Social events that promote good fellowship and camaraderie may occasionally be scheduled. These events may or may not include the invitation to bring spouses or guests.

4.6.4.6. The Annual Awards Dinner is the responsibility of the Executive Board.

4.6.5. The Executive Board must approve the planning and scheduling of all official Lost Tracks Men's Club events, opportunities, and social gatherings before they can be officially scheduled. Travel golf outings organized by small ad hoc groups or individuals are exempt from this By-Law unless they wish to become an official event/outing of the Men's Club.

4.7. Lost Tracks Golf Club

4.7.1. The Course offers a reduced rate for season passes to all Lost Track Men's Club members.

4.7.1.1. Season passes are either a 5-day pass or 7-day pass.

4.7.1.2. Range pass and/or cart pass is also available with the season pass.

4.7.1.3. The Executive Board annually negotiates rates with the course.

4.7.1.4. Season passes purchased by December 31 of the previous year the pass is for will receive a discount.

4.7.1.5. Season passes are purchased at the course.

4.7.1.6. Official Membership cards will indicate the type of season pass along with a range pass, cart pass, or both depending on what the member purchased.

4.7.1.7. Membership cards are available at the outset of the season and must be picked up in the Pro Shop.

4.7.2. The Executive Board or Committee Chairmen (when given that authority) will handle all official "Club" interactions with the course ownership and/or management on behalf of the Club members.

4.7.2.1. Any Lost Tracks Men's Club concerns or issues that involve course conditions, club house management, bar/kitchen personnel, course workers, customer service, ownership/management decisions and/or conduct, and other overarching Club issues that involve the course shall be directed to appropriate committee or to the Executive Board.

4.7.2.2. Any individual personal concerns between a member and the course, its ownership/management, individual personnel, etc. shall be appropriately and maturely addressed by the individual member. Should this occur, please remember this: Members are expected to conduct themselves in such a manner that exemplifies the Club's Values, supports its Services, and contributes to its Vision and will not bring the name or image of the Club into disrepute.

4.7.2.3. Lost Tracks Men's Club assumes no liability on behalf of any member in regards to individual disputes, conflict resolution, or legal actions taken between the individual and Lost Tracks Golf Club.
